

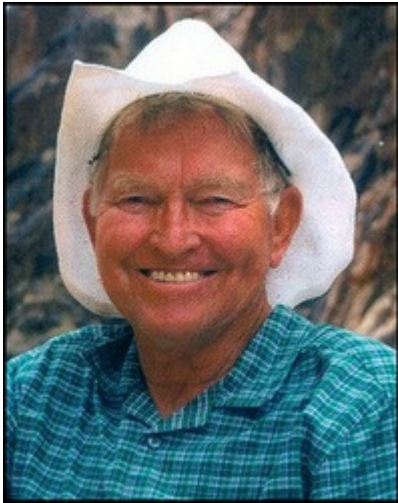

Amil Quayle was born in St. Anthony, in 1938. Through high school he worked on various farms and developed a deep appreciation and love for the land. In 1961 he ran his first river trip and was hooked. He became a full-time guide, mostly on the Grand Canyon. He earned a B.S. degree in sociology from the University of Utah, then received a PhD from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. He taught writing classes there, and at Idaho State University and Utah State University. Amil has written several books of poetry and short stories. 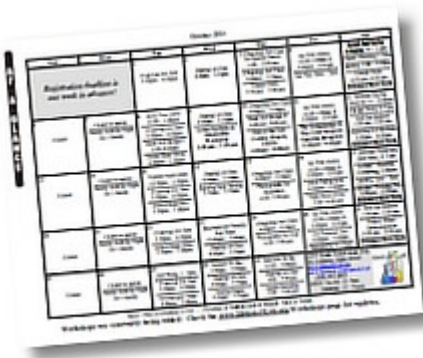

Pioneer Art Show

Artists are invited to submit up to 5 pieces of artwork (more if small works, fine crafts, custom jewelry, etc.) in the Pioneer Art Show celebrating Pioneer Days here in St. Anthony. Space permitting, every entry will be included. All mediums are acceptable, including assemblages. Two dimensional artwork must be wired, ready to hang, with a frame or wrapped canvas (no side staples). Maximum size (including frame) is 5 ft. high by 6 ft. wide, however, smaller pieces are preferred.

Theme: This show encourages not just art with a pioneer/historic theme but any old photographs (wired & framed) that celebrate the pioneer spirit here in Idaho. Artists, drop in to the Lab to look through our archives of old photos of St. Anthony and select one to use as reference for your artwork (\$6, includes B & W printout of chosen image)

To submit artwork: Please read and sign the Exhibition Application and the Liability Waiver/Sales Agreement ([download](#)) and bring artwork in during the Drop off dates (below).

Entry Fee: \$10.00 per piece or volunteer for one hour per piece. Contact us if submitting more than 5 pieces.

Drop off date: Tuesday, June 24- Saturday, June 28

Meet The Artists Opening Reception: Friday, July 11, 5:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. Live music, refreshments.

Frames: Now, along with our high-end fine art supplies we have used and new frames in all shapes, sizes and colors.

Thank you to all of our supporters who donated frames or placed them on consignment. We all know how expensive framing can be. Now there is an inexpensive way to professional frame your artwork for exhibition in our gallery.

Craft Items: We have just received a huge donation of new kid's art and craft items! We have kid's Airbrush Kits, jewelry making kits, wooden frames to paint and, as always, Heidi's \$1.00 Craft Kits for boys and girls.

Clay: Daniel has been mixing and pugging clay all week. We sell in bulk, at a discount, to local schools but the retail price for smaller quantities is \$1.00/lb. in 2, 10 & 25 pound bags. This is low fire clay that fires to white and, as Tyler Davis of North Fremont High School says, is exceptional for pottery or sculpture.

Kiln rental = \$25.00 or about \$1.00/inch (widest width + highest height)

Clay all-inclusive price = \$6.00/lb. This cover the cost of clay, bisque firing, glazing and glaze firing.

Beginning / Intermediate Acrylic Painting
Workshop by Artist-in-Residence, Betsy Popp

The Idaho Art Lab offers artist residencies to artists from around the world, giving local artists a chance to meet and learn from exceptional, award-winning artists.

This workshop will be a combination of demonstration and participation. Betsy will discuss and demonstrate color and color mixing and creating a working palette.

She will discuss and demonstrate a three value preliminary sketch, which will develop into our final painting. She will also discuss paint application, composition and why it is not the color but the value of the color that counts.

Betsy and the Lab will provide:

- Acrylic paint (or you can bring your own brand)
- Brushes (Betsy has a variety of brushes that you are welcome to use, but if you have favorite brushes feel free to bring them)
- 9 x 12 gessoed masonite panel (or bring your own canvas)
- Image to work from (we will have photographs of local landscapes or bring your own)

A little more about Betsy: The northwoods of Wisconsin have always been home for Betsy. This has given her the opportunity to study and sketch her favorite wildlife subjects within an easy drive of her home. She works in a variety of mediums, which include fine pencil drawings, colorful acrylic paintings, vibrant pastels, unique wood burnings, and detailed wood carvings. Such a wide variety of original artwork, yet all uniquely the work of Betsy Popp.

Betsy Popp is a widely recognized and award-winning artist. She studied at UW-Stevens Point and graduated with a broad field Art Education degree. She obtained her Masters of Fine Arts degree from the Academy of Art University, San Francisco, CA. Betsy owns and operates 'Betsy Popp - Fine Art Gallery' in Townsend, WI, which also serves as her working studio and custom frame shop since 1996. For nearly 20 years, Betsy has instructed adult studio art courses through Northeast Wisconsin Technical College, Green Bay and throughout the country. More recently Betsy instructs Art History and a Watercolor Studio course through Upper Iowa University. She has served as 'Artist in Residence' in National Parks across the country, including:

- Everglades, FL
- Acadia, ME
- The Badlands, SD
- Sapelo Island, GA
- Pictured Rocks National Lakeshore, Michigan
- Porcupine Mountain Wilderness Area, Michigan
- and now, Idaho Art Lab
